1850: Sir, one day you can tax it....

Michael Faraday to a sceptical William Gladstone, then British Chancellor of the Exchequer about the probability of use of electricity.

1835

"If the presence of electricity can be made visible in any part of the circuit, I see no reason why intelligence may not be transmitted instantaneously by electricity"

1861: Only 17 years after Morse developed his code, the telegraph network spanned as far as California across the US.

1861 – 1865 the American Civil War. The news of Lincoln's assignation takes 12 days to reach London.







1819: Cyrus Field is born on Nov 30th, the 7th of the 8 sons of the Reverend David Field at Stockbridge, Massachusetts.

1833: At the age of 16 he heads for New York city to make his fortune in business.

1854: At the age of 34, he is introduced to a Canadian engineer Frederick Gisborne by his brother Mathew. He envisages a transatlantic cable connecting the 'old' and 'new' worlds via Valentia in South Kerry.

1856: The first attempt fails

1858: Second attempt. Cable successfully laid. Major celebrations as Anglo worlds are connected BUT cable fails within a month.

1866: The fourth attempt, using the worlds largest ship, the "Great Eastern", is a success and the time for transatlantic communication is reduced from 2 weeks to 2 minutes – a precursor to today's






















The project was also endorsed in the National Development Plan published in February 2018 and again in October 2021



Currently working towards formal inscription as a transatlantic project, together with Canada, in 2029









